
### ST. FRANCIS DE SALES

He died on December 28, 1622, in Lyon.

#### **FIORITURA**



Guinness says a world record is not simply a fact but a way to measure ourselves. Knowing "the biggest, the smallest, the fastest, the most and the least," it says, helps us understand our position in the world and how we fit in.

On the occasion of the 75th year of Indian Independence and Children's Day 2022, SFS Academy organised SFS Academy World Records Festival 2022 from November 13 – 14, 2022. This festival was the first of its kind in India where three records were broken consecutively focusing on patriotism and the Fit India Movement. In this regard the Principal, Rev. Academy for the titles, Largest National Flag made with Origami Boats by a Team, Most National Flags Coloured by a Team in 1 Hour (Single Venue) and Most Participants Performing in a Sports Drill Holding a Ball Simultaneously (Single Venue).

SFS Academy was blessed with over 900 press coverage from different countries, like, the USA, UAE, Italy, France, Malaysia, Singapore, Japan, Canada, Mexico and many more.

#### 1. Largest National Flag made with Origami Boats by a Team

As a part of the 75th year of Indian Independence Celebrations, the students and the teaching and non-teaching staff made 2,30,000 origami boats on November 10, 2022, in 7 hours. These origami boats were gathered together on November 13, 2022, and pasted in the form of a mosaic to reflect the Indian National Flag. A team of 1090 students and 132 staff were involved for 4 hours and 15 minutes to create the Indian National Flag. After this, the students and staff took

a pledge together emphasising Green India. SFS Academy broke the record in the category "Largest National Flag made with Origami Boats" by creating as large as 600 square meters of the Indian National Flag surpassing the previous record of 121.50 square meters in Malaysia on December 1, 2001.

#### 2. Most National Flags Coloured by a Team in 1 Hour (Single Venue)

This is a new world record breaking the previous record created by 511 participants by colouring 1290 flags in Bahrain on November 22, 2013.


### 3. Most Participants Performing in a Sports Drill Holding a Ball Simultaneously (Single Venue)


record surpassing the previous record of 505 participants in Dubai on October 10, 2018.












#### **Exploring the Art Forms of Uttarakhand**

Students of grade X were given an opportunity to explore one of the art forms of Uttarakhand through an artintegrated project called Aipan Art. It was assigned to the students to encourage them to see its correlation with the study of circles in Math and to know the values and cultural identity behind this traditional art. The Aipan Art originated in Almora and flourished during the rule of the Chand dynasty in Kumaon.

Aipan pattern (Yantra) is drawn with an exact purpose in mind. It is marked by a flower or dot, which represents the universe. The lotuses stand for the moon, the home, stars, and wealth. There are usually other round designs (circles) around the attraction. The circles are bounded by lines on four sides suggesting doors, which are known as Bhupur. They represent the Earth.





Sandalwood is a tree that is specially grown in the forests of Karnataka. Perfume, soaps with carvings, and medicines are manufactured from sandalwood. They are popular all over the world and are supplied to other parts of the country and also exported to foreign countries. Due to this reason, Karnataka is known as 'the Land of Sandalwood'.


The students and the staff presented the best of their talents starting from the decoration of his office and the stage to the presentation of a mind-blowing cultural program.








The celebration was a success as the kindergarten students participated with great enthusiasm.






**PREKG:** Students gathered in the quadrangle and were given a library book to read. After their reading time, a video on phonic sounds was played.



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




Are you afraid of the curses? It was while I was glancing through the pages of a newly bought encyclopedia that a strange name struck my eyes. Tutankhamun. A tomb of a pharaoh, with a lot of priceless treasures and the mysterious stories of the curse around it. It aroused the curiosity of a history lover in me. I started reading more about Egypt and it's much talked about Tutankhamun's curse. I am sharing the story of Tutankhamun and his curse with you all here.

> King Tutankhamun or King Tut was the last of the royal family during the end of the 18<sup>th</sup> dynasty in the New Kingdom in Egyptian history. He

took the throne at the age of 9 when his father King Akhenaten died. King Tut mysteriously died at the age of 18. The real reason for his death has not yet been clarified by archaeologists. His burial place was lost for many years.

King Tutankhamun's tomb was discovered in late 1922, by British Archaeologists Howard Carter and his financial backer Lord Carnarvon. They were searching under the sands of Egypt when they found the tomb. The burial chamber was surrounded by gold, jewellery, chariots, clothing and artefacts. These were, as Egyptians believed saved for the afterlife. After years of searching, they found the tomb of the young king. Lord Carnarvon and Howard Carter immediately became celebrities. A few days after the discovery of the tomb Lord Carnarvon was found dead because of an infected mosquito bite which led to blood poisoning. He wasn't the only one who was dead. His half-brother also died from blood poisoning. Sir Archibald Douglas who had x-rayed the mummy, died from a mysterious illness, Arthur Mace who was in Carter's excavation team died due to arsenic poisoning and was followed by many other people who were part of the discovery of the tomb. This led many people to believe that this was all because of a curse that priests had put on tomb robbers during the mummification of the young king. Although researchers haven't found any curse, people still believe in it.

## YlnMn Blue - The First Blue Pigment in Over 200 Years

In the past, It was difficult to find Blue pigments unlike colours like Red, Yellow and Brown which are easy to find in nature. But that was not the case for the vibrant blue colour. In the past, many people had tried making the blue pigment but most of them were unsuccessful.

Ancient Egyptians had the
Egyptian Blue and it was used
throughout ancient Egypt and
Ancient Rome. But during the
middle ages, the people of Egypt
decided to either lose or destroy all
the instructions to make the Egyptian
Blue and how to make it forever.

And then, the next blue colour that came out was Lapis Lazuli. It was a very good colour. It's still around today but the problem with it was that it was only mined out of a specific cave in Afghanistan, and it has a very limited supply. It is made synthetically.

There are many more pigments like cobalt blue, and cerulean blue - it is very transparent and is more of a mix of green than a purely blue colour. Prussian blue is another very deep blue colour and not a perfect blue. These were the only synthetic choices of the blue we had. They all were present during the 1800s.

But it all changed when at Oregon State University in 2009, a lead chemist and his graduate student were trying out and testing out the electronic properties of Manganese. In the oven, they added three ingredients- Yttrium, Indium and Manganese and let it bake overnight at over 2000 °F, and in the morning when they opened up the oven they had seen a brand new blue pigment. And unlike the other blues throughout history, YInMn Blue was incredible.

Properties of YInMn Blue -

- YInMn Blue could block out UV rays. If it was painted on a house, the paint would never fade in the sun.
- It is also resistant to high and low temperatures.

YInMn Blue is also very safe to manufacture and it's also safe for humans to work with. It is also safe for the environment. YInMn blue is expensive because of the elements it is made of. It costs \$179.40 which is around Rs. 13,000 for just 40 ML.


## My Dream SCIENCE LAB



Trigonometry is one of the most ancient subjects studied by scholars all over the world.

It is helpful in almost every aspect of life. It is used in oceanography, seismology, metrology, electronics, stellar, locations, solar & lunar distances, criminology, marine biology etc.

The great Trigonometry survey was a project that aimed to survey the entire Indian subcontinent with specific precision. It was begun in 1802 by the British army infantry offices William Lambton, under the leadership of his successor, George Everest, the project was made responsible to survey India.

Among the many accomplishments of the survey was the demarcation of British territories in India and the measurement of the height of the Himalayan giants - Everest, K2 Kanchenjunga.

The great Trigonometry survey of British India began on 10 April 1802 with the measurement of a baseline near Madras for which the second largest ever theodolites were built.

Theodolite is a surveying instrument with a rotating telescope for measuring horizontal and vertical angles.

During the survey in 1852, the highest mountain in the world was discovered. From a distance of over 160 km, the peak was observed from 6 stations. In 1856, the peak was named after 'Six George Everest' who first used Theodolites. These are now on display in the museum of the survey of India in Dehradun.

## **REIMANN HYPOTHESIS**

It's a millennium problem
which remains unproved in
mathematics. Countless fields
such as quantum mechanics
and cryptography assume that
Reimann's hypothesis is true without its proof.

What is it?

Ever wondered about the position or the pattern of prime numbers or if could we predict their occurrence in the number system up to  $\infty$ ?

(Note: In this article, we simultaneously think about numerical as well as graphical occurrences on the Cartesian plane.)

Suppose we look at the graph of where primes pop up to 3 million (according to Gause's data). We can see a curve so the trick for mathematicians was to give another function having the same, similar convertible graph (with the basic essence of the function). Gause found one graph of the logarithmic integral function  $(\frac{1}{\log(x)})$  which looked similar (Gauses prime counting function).

Let us now go into a flashback to the time of Leonard Euler who contributed significantly to the field of mathematics.

One of his contributions was the basic Zeta function which derives the infinite sum of all the numbers in the series,  $\frac{1}{1s}$ ,  $\frac{1}{2s}$ ,  $\frac{1}{3s}$ , ... ... ...  $\frac{1}{ns}$  where S is any number, turns out that the sum of this is finite. Thus formed the series is convergent.

The connection between this and prime numbers is that when you add up 1 over all the powers of the primes and then multiply all such series of prime

numbers over all the prime numbers you get the Zeta function. But still, this connection was intimate.

This is when Bernhard Riemann comes into the picture. He brought along with him the knowledge of complex analysis.

He allowed S to be a complex number in the Zeta function. But when he did this he found that this graph only converged when the real part of the S was K. Therefore he used the technic of analytic continuation by which he successfully extended the Zeta function S real part to 1 > values as well. Thereby making an overlapped brand-new function.

Remember the Gauses prime counting function in the initial part of the article.

Bernhard slightly modified it instead of raising the graph line by 1 on primes which Gause did he raised it by log(p) (where p is the prime)

When he did this he found a surprising connection between his new Zeta function and the modification. He realized that the non-trivial zeros which exactly lied on the critical strip between 0 and 1. He now hypothesized ( the main theme of this article) that they lie on exactly one line where the real part of S is  $\frac{1}{2}$ .

So now every time he added a non-trivial Zeta zero it led to a harmonic to the wave he discovered which corresponds to the Zeta function at S equals to 1. When these harmonics were added infinitely. They resulted in the prime counting function.

So now it seems like everything is done but the single major fact that everything Zeta zero lies on the critical line of  $S=\frac{1}{2}$  remains unproven, that is what we get to do seems simple right?

# Coordinate Geometry and Its Applications

Imagine you are out on a tour by car. It's you, your mother and your father and your father is driving the car. Suddenly you realize you are on the wrong path to the destination. You start panicking! Then you realize that you could use the Google map app on your phone. After specifying the destination, it shows the exact path to be taken. It also shows the distance between you and your destination, and you will come to know the exact speed and time required. "What a wonderful thing!" you start exclaiming, but do you know how this works?

It comes down to one thing coordinate geometry. Coordinate geometry is used in our everyday life in various ways. Its applications are very wide, associated with distance and exact location of places on earth, physics, engineering, navigation, seismology, art, digital maps, paper maps, and finding distance and area of coordinates.

Its invention and discovery had a very humorous history. The story goes like this: Once a mathematician lay casually on his bed staring at the walls and ceiling of the room. He then noticed a fly flying around the room and on the ceiling. The flies flew around and then rested on a certain part of the ceiling. It then repeated this process several times. The mathematician then started to see this location on the ceiling as coordinates represented as numbers. He divided the ceiling into four quadrants and named the coordinates accordingly. This way the concept of coordinate geometry was brought into existence by Rene Descartes. He is the father of coordinate geometry. Today we cannot imagine the world without the applications of coordinate geometry.

## **Collatz Conjecture**

The Collatz conjecture is an elusive problem in mathematics regarding the oneness of natural numbers when run through a specific function based on being odd or even, especially stating that regardless of the initial number the series will eventually reach the number 1.

Collatz Conjecture Function:

f(n)

if n is even 3n + 1 if n is odd

#### Steps:

- 1. Take any positive integer "n" of your choice.
- 2. To obtain the next number in the sequence, check if the number is even or odd.
- 3. If n is even, divide it by 2.
- 4. If n is odd, multiply it by 3 and add 1.
- 5. Repeat steps 3-4 to keep obtaining the next numbers in the sequence.

Example: n = 10

10 is even = 10


 $10 \div 2 = 5$  is odd.

3(5) + 1 = 16 is even,

 $16 \div 2 = 8$  is even.

 $8 \div 2 = 4$ .

But we already got 4 in sequence, which goes down to 2, then 1. This 4-2-1 loop continues till infinity! So, our finite sequence of unique numbers observed is 10, 5, 16, 8, 4, 2, 1, which is also called the hailstone sequence.



It is also known by multiple names like Ulam conjecture, Kakutani's problems, Syracuse problem, Thwaites conjecture or simply the 3n + 1 conjecture.

Collatz Conjecture observes that "Whatever arbitrary positive integer "K" you begin with, you will always have a finite set of numbers in the generated sequence, ending in a closed loop of 4-2-1".
