Principal's Message



"Change is inevitable, growth is optional." - John C Maxwell

Contemplating my student days and job as the Principal of schools in various places, I find no parallel between then and now frenetically transformed teacher-student relationship. It upsets me when I sometimes experience teachers complaining about students. Moreover, today's students rarely hesitate to speak ill of their teachers.

In the good old days, teaching was a much-respected profession and a word from the mouth of teachers was a law by itself. In schools, corporal punishment was usual and the offending students were even criticized by their teachers. Parents never complained, but rather scolded their children for wrongs committed by them in school. With due respect to everyone, I will pen down two of my school time happenings (amongst many) that would perhaps appear strange and very unusual in today's scenario.

Our school Principal, a strict disciplinarian, never tolerated latecomers and the punishment was to do frog jumping or running across the playground. Today I feel that despite being an excellent teacher and administrator and with all his good intentions, his strict measures might have caused physical and emotional discomfort. Yet I cannot deny the fact that his measures had instilled the value of punctuality in most of my classmates and made us physically and emotionally stronger in the long run.

I also remember my chemistry teacher who used to make us write impositions whenever we couldn't answer his questions correctly. I remember that I had to write the chemical formula of sulphuric acid 200 times since I couldn't answer his question that day. I as a student felt that the punishment was ruthless and meaningless at that moment. But I had to follow the instructions because as I have mentioned earlier it was a law that couldn't be ignored. Today, to my surprise, I realize the fact that I don't remember any other chemical formula except H2SO4.

The teachers in those days used to scold and punish out of respect for their total commitment to students' welfare. The then students never grudged or so to say never dared to grudge this attitude of the teachers. But it's highly implausible that such behaviour of teachers with all good intentions would ever be acceptable to the present generation.

On the other hand, I am also aware and I do strongly agree that there has been a tremendous change in the teacher-student relationship for the welfare of the student community. In the past, society has witnessed several instances of severe corporal punishments that created havoc in students' lives by restricting the further growth of young individuals. Secondly, the one-way communication while teaching in the earlier days never encouraged the creative side of the students but rather forced them into rote learning instead of real learning. The freedom of expression enjoyed by the students of today is definitely in the process of creating more mature and individualistic citizens of tomorrow. There are also many examples of the physical and emotional breakdown of students due to harsh punishments and humiliating comments. The present-day restrictions do rightly take care of the rights of children.

Yet, I am profoundly confused today if the drastic change in the teacher-student relationship will provide us with a better future generation or if there's a genuine need for parents and teachers to think about it

more deeply and understand if there's a need of bridging the gap by following a middle path instead of both the extremes; if by doing so, we can make our citizens of tomorrow physically and emotionally stronger so that they are capable of facing the real life beyond schools and colleges and can fight out their failures successfully. If the change has brought some good, has it also not become associated with some demerits?






RGCARPE DIEM




Who was Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan?

As an academic, philosopher, and statesman, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan (1888-1975) was one of the most recognized and influential Indian thinkers in academic circles in the 20th century. Throughout his life and extensive writing career, Radhakrishnan sought to define, defend, and promulgate his religion, a religion he variously identified as Hinduism, Vedanta, and the religion of the Spirit. He sought to demonstrate that his Hinduism was both philosophically coherent and ethically viable. Radhakrishnan's concern for experience and his extensive knowledge of the Western philosophical and literary traditions has earned him the reputation of being a bridge-builder between India and the West. He often appears to feel at home in the Indian as well as the Western philosophical contexts, and draws from both Western and Indian sources throughout his writing. Because of this, Radhakrishnan has been held up in academic circles as a representative of Hinduism to the West. His lengthy writing career and his many published works have been influential in shaping the West's understanding of Hinduism, India, and the East.


Why is Teacher's Day celebrated on September 5 every year?

Since the year 1962, Teacher's Day is celebrated in India on September 5 every year in honour of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, who was an Indian philosopher, political leader, and the second President of Independent India (between 1962 to 1967). Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan was born on September 5, 1888. He deeply believed that "teachers should be the best minds in the country". And so every year, since 1962, in honour of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan's birthday and his philosophies September 5 is celebrated as Teachers' Day. Each year he is remembered on this day for his immense contributions to building our nation.



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
